The Bureau of Meteorology is progressively upgrading its forecast system to provide more detailed forecasts across Australia

From the end of October 2011, new and improved district forecasts will be introduced in South Australia.

Forecast issued at 5:40 am CST on Tuesday 27 September 2011.

#### Weather Situation

A vigorous west to southwesterly change will continue over the northeast of the State this evening, gradually moderating from the west as a high pressure system enters the west of the State overnight and on Tuesday. The high will move to New South Wales on Wednesday and a front will move over South Australia on Thursday followed by a new high that is forecast to move to the south of the State.

#### Forecast for the rest of Tuesday

Partly cloudy. Scattered showers this afternoon and evening. Winds northeast to northwesterly averaging 15 to 30 km/h becoming light by early evening. Daytime maximum temperatures in the low 30s.

Fire Danger - Very High

UV Alert from 9:20 am to 2:30 pm, UV Index predicted to reach 5 [Moderate]

#### Wednesday 28 September

Partly cloudy. Showers. Scattered thunderstorms in the early afternoon. Winds north to northwesterly averaging 15 to 30 km/h tending west to northwesterly up to 40 km/h around midday. Overnight temperatures falling to between 13 and 16 with daytime temperatures reaching the mid 20s.

#### Thursday 29 September

Partly cloudy. Scattered light showers, becoming less likely by early evening. The chance of thunderstorms late in the morning. Winds west to southwesterly averaging 30 to 45 km/h decreasing below 30 km/h by early evening. Overnight temperatures falling to around 10 with daytime temperatures reaching around 18.

#### Friday 30 September

Partly cloudy. Light showers developing around dawn. Winds west to southwesterly averaging 15 to 25 km/h, reaching 35 km/h at times. Overnight temperatures falling to around 9 with daytime temperatures reaching around 18.

The next routine forecast will be issued at 4:15 pm CST Tuesday.
